In July 2014, NISD unveiled the district's new Community Dashboard, an interactive, mobile-friendly website providing student, staff and district operational information in one location. Keeping with the district's mission of establishing a premier education for all students, NISD believes the success of students is attributed to a partnership with the community. That's why NISD asked for the assistance of community members, parents, staff, students and administrators to identify community values and proposed measures of success in NISD. Together, the community developed the Community-Based Accountability Measures of Success. This assessment goes beyond the test score and measures student achievement in areas including internships, SAT/ACT scores, college scholarships, dual credit courses and more. The dashboard also provides easy access to a variety of information including human resources, fiscal data, community relations and state assessments. E-Portfolio

For the past seven years, NISD has provided a digital learning device to secondary students. As part of the district's long-range technology plan, all secondary students received a Dell Latitude 10 Tablet, equipped with wireless networking and software including the district's filtering system.

Students are using these devices in many ways such as creating e-portfolios as a way to showcase and present their work in a thematic design. This year, students are encouraged to present multiple products in their e-portfolios at TechnoExpo, the district's K-12 technology showcase. This promotes meaningful organization as well as prioritizing the best of their work to showcase to an authentic audience.

Got Growth?

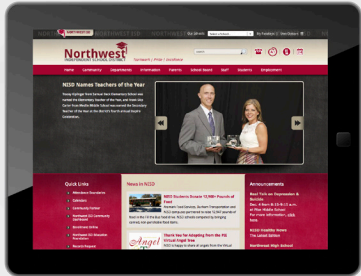
Demographic projections show student enrollment in Northwest ISD will increase to 30,000 students within the next eight to ten years. As one of the fastest growing school districts in the state, NISD operates strategically and embraces the challenge of planning for new facilities that provide support to enhance the student learning environment.

In November 2012, voters approved a \$255 million bond referendum to provide for 4,000 additional new student seats, V.R. Eaton High School, a future middle school (opening in August 2017), technology and building additions. In 2010, the Board reestablished the optimal capacity for buildings with 450 students to 650 and 650 students to 850, saving the district more than \$3 million in operating costs. With more than 8,000 square feet of additions added to Beck Elementary School, students were welcomed at the start of the 2014-2015 school year with an extended cafeteria, additional art and music rooms, a new kitchen and two new resource rooms. Peterson Elementary School received approximately 14,000 square feet of additions which included six new classrooms to the kindergarten and fifth grade wing, an extended cafeteria and gym and new music and art rooms. Both projects are part of the 2008 bond referendum.

The district will soon enter the planning and design phase for the sixth middle school located next to Eaton High School.

Eaton High School



In October 2014, NISD administration, school board members, community and architecture and construction crews celebrated as the final beam was added to the top of the district's third comprehensive high school, V.R. Eaton High School. Eaton High School, home of the green and blue Eagles, will open in far north Fort Worth/Haslet in August 2015. Features include a full-sized library with a coffee shop, a cafeteria with outdoor seating, flex learning space that provides a project-based learning environment and a courtyard with WiFi Internet access.

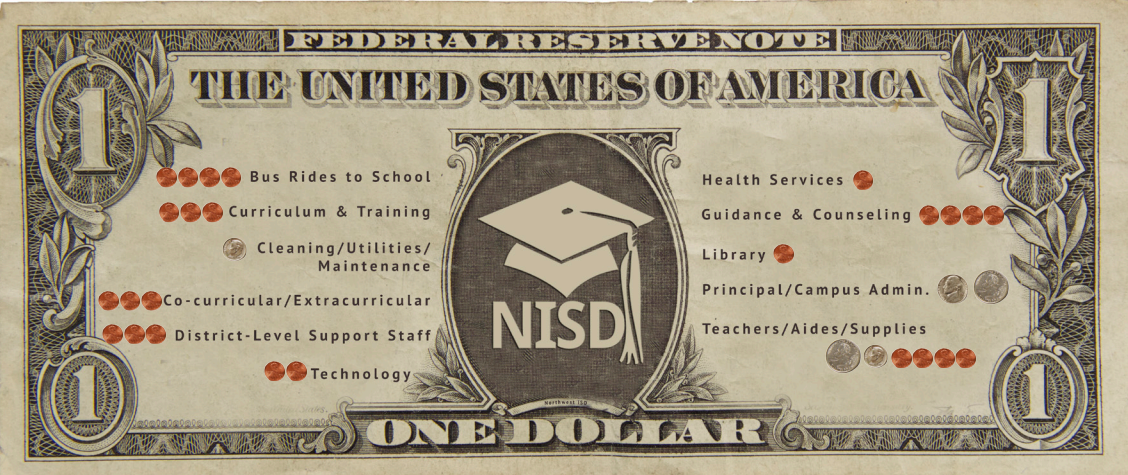

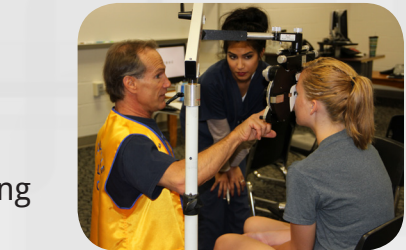
